ECC Team meeting highlights for Jan. and Feb. 2012

In Jan, we elected officers and discussed land use and historic issues. **In Feb,** we approved permits for Papi Tino's restaurant, took no action on a demolition of 1613 Willow, and had lots of committee reports especially on SXSW and traffic safety on E. 5-6th.

We are still accepting nominations for Sector Reps for Sectors 7 and 2. We have geographic Resident Sector Representatives so all parts of the neighborhood have an equal voice. See the Sector Map on the next page. Nominees for Sector Rep must live in the Sector, be able to attend monthly meeting held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month from 6—7:30 pm usually at Terrazas Library, and be willing to communicate/pass flyers to neighbors in their sector. Most people nominate themselves out of a concern that no one else is stepping up to speak for their part of the neighborhood.

We also need a volunteer to represent civic groups, non-profits and congregations who operate or serve residents in our neighborhood, this slot doesn't require the volunteer to live in the area. We do have business, civic and spiritual reps who are also residents in our planning area but an individual can only serve in one position. Nominees should be able to attend monthly meeting held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month from 6—7:30 pm usually at Terrazas Library, and be willing to communicate/pass flyers among the non-resident stakeholders they are representing. Most people nominate themselves for this important slot after a pep talk by another Team member.
